

PART QUALIFICATIONS AND SPECIALISATIONS

Definition of a Part Qualification

- A part qualification is defined on the NQF as being an assessed unit of learning that is registered as part of a qualification.
- The QCTO utilised the abovementioned definition and contextualised it as follows:

In the OQSF context a part qualification is an assessed unit of learning that is registered as part of a qualification. A part qualification, in this context is a set of employable skills that can be extracted from an occupational qualification. When an occupational qualification is developed, certain skill sets, as determined by industry, can be used to employ people to do some of the tasks performed in the full occupation.

Principles for the Registration of Part Qualifications

- Parts must be motivated in terms of the impact it will have on employment numbers.
- Parts must have a purpose in terms of employment.
- Parts must be employable skills.
- Parts must be identified during the scoping meeting and confirmed during the profiling prior to developing the qualification.
- Parts must be made up of modules as only modules carry credits.

Principles Continued

- Parts will be made up of the knowledge, practical skills, work experience and external final summative assessment components of the qualification.
- Parts should be at least 25 credits.
- Parts will undergo the same stringent summative assessment as for the parent qualification.
- All completed parts will be recognised towards the parent qualification.
- Part qualifications will be registered on the NLRD.
- The same AQP must be responsible for all assessments.

Principles Continued

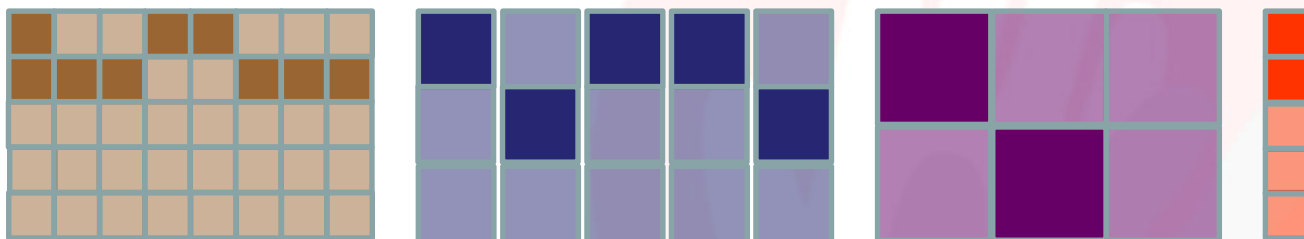
- There must be a parent and part qualification relationship and a part qualification must comply with all the requirements and rules applicable to the parent qualification.
- Part qualifications must be numbered using the same curriculum number as that of the parent qualification extended by a # and two digits.
- Part qualifications must be recorded in the qualification, curriculum and the assessment specifications.
- The naming convention must satisfy the approved QCTO naming convention.
- Credit and NQF Level allocation must meet the approved QCTO allocation convention.
